CONSERVATION COMMENTS

The Preble SWCD is once again offering a variety of trees and a handful of perennials for purchase this year. Orders will be due Friday, March 1st and cash or check will be accepted as payment. On the list for 2024 we are offering white pine, Norway spruce, American arborvitae, basswood, black walnut, Kentucky coffeetree, shellbark hickory, swamp white oak, sweetgum, pawpaw, persimmon, redbud, black elderberry, common lilac, nannyberry, and ninebark. Perennials include beebalm (bergamot), yarrow, sedum, and asparagus. You will be able to enjoy these plants for years to come!

The trees come in packets containing 10 for evergreens, and 5 trees per pack for all other trees listed. The trees are bare rooted, meaning there is no soil on the root ball. An average order of 1-2 year old bare-root stock will fit in a grocery bag. Prices and availability vary between species. Be sure to order what you want quickly to guarantee your plants will be stocked. All plants have been selected to grow quite well in our area. The plants offered

can provide shelter, are a food source our native wildlife can consume, and aid to keep our forests free of honeysuckle. Persimmon, pawpaw, and elderberry all come with the added bonus of being delicious to humans as well as animals.

Pick up your purchases on April 10th between 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. at our office. It is important to get your trees in the ground as soon as you are able and make sure to water them adequately. This will allow the trees to have the best chance of survival. We thank everyone for their continued interest in our environment year after year. Preble SWCD Turns 75 This Year!


In December of 1948, 221 concerned residents of Preble County petitioned to form what was originally known as the Preble Soil Conservation District. hearing was held on January 7th to determine the 'desirability and necessity of such District.' Following the hearing, the Ohio Soil Conservation Committee determined that there was a need for the District and a referendum was held on January 31, 1949. The vote of the referendum was 93% in favor of creation of the District. On February 16, 1949, the Preble Soil Conservation District was formed by an act of the Ohio Soil Conservation Committee.

In 1963, the word 'water' was added to the name to better reflect the scope of the work at the District, and the Preble Soil and Water Conservation District came to be named what it still is today.

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2024 & 2025 CRP Grassed Waterway Re-Enrollment

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and Preble Soil & Water Conservation District are preparing for site visits to grassed waterways that could be re-enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP). If your CRP grassed waterway is nearing its 10 or 20 year anniversary, you may be eligible! Cooperators with CRP contracts expiring in 2024 should have received a letter about re-enrolling their grassed waterway in the program. If you wish to continue in the program, please call the Preble SWCD office at (937) 456-5159 or NRCS at (937) 456-4211 ext. 3 to confirm your interest. For contracts that will expire in 2025, please be prepared for our District or NRCS staff to visit and review your grassed waterway. Here are some proactive tips to ensure the eligibility for re-enrollment:

- Repair any tile holes that may be present in or near the waterway
- Remember to mow the grass to maintain the grass stand and control weeds
- Clear out any brush growing in the waterway and in rock inlets or outlets
- Take a look for silt that may have been washed into the waterway

Timber Theft in Ohio: A Brief Summary

What Is Timber Theft?

When someone enters another person's property and knowingly cuts and removes a tree or trees without the permission of the landowner it is known as timber theft.

Why Is Timber Theft a Problem?

The answer is really quite simple. Timber has value! The monetary value of timber in Ohio can be highly variable, but it can be as high as a few thousand dollars per tree or tens of thousands of dollars per acre. In many cases, it is relatively simple to steal timber with only a slight risk of getting caught.

Theft as Part of a Timber Sale

In the case of timber disputes that arise from ongoing timber harvests, it is often the word of the property owner against that of the logger or operator. Without a well-written contract that makes it absolutely clear which trees are to be harvested and the amount and method of compensation for the landowner, it is often impossible to prove that a "theft" has occurred.

Summary of How to Prevent Timber Theft

- Locate and clearly mark property boundaries.
- Inspect property regularly. If you do not live on the property, hire a forester or ask a neighbor or relative to periodically walk the
 property.
- Leave contact information with neighbors and let them know that you do not plan to harvest timber in the near future.
- Conduct a timber inventory and estimate the value of your timber.
- Report all incidents of trespass and/or theft to the authorities.

When Conducting a Timber Sale

- Do your homework prior to the sale. Ohio's Call Before You Cut campaign is a great place to start: 1-877-424-8288 or visit <u>callb4ucut.com</u>.
- Clearly mark sale and property boundaries.
- Notify neighbors of the impending sale and verify that boundaries are correct.
- Paint each tree to be harvested and keep a record of the number of trees to be harvested. Categorize by species and size.
- Sell timber using the "sealed bid" process and secure a "lump-sum" payment prior to the start of harvesting activities.
- Develop a detailed contract with the help of an experienced forester and lawyer.
- Get help from a qualified forester to assist with all aspects of the sale from marking trees, to contract development, to inspection
 during and at completion of the contract: osafdirectory.com.
